Toribio Quimada dies in a fire set in his home.

1988

UUA changed its rule to allow non-North American groups into the UUA. UUCP is accepted as member congregation.

MOVE AHEAD 2 SPACES.

The UCP changed its name to the Unitarian Universalist Church of the Philippines (UUCP) and requested membership in the UUA.

1954

Inglesia Universal de Cristo church does not approve of Quimada's association with the liberal Universalist church in the US, so he is kicked out.
